

EPA Report- Discovery of Slag at 679 Darlington Circle

- Problem: Elevated levels of lead and visible slag in backyard residential soil on Darlington Circle
 - Adjacent property owner complained of slag in their backyard
 - Scope of work changed to sample more properties in the neighborhood
 - 5 total properties near discovery site gave access for testing
- Results:
 - Only 671 and 679 Darlington Circle samples were above the EPA RML 400ppm in the backyards only.
- Solution: Need to do a removal action to clean up the lead contaminated soil and backfill with clean soil.
- Theories on how the slag got there
 - The backyards are so steep and unique compared to others in the neighborhood.
 Slag and other misc from municipal source was used as fill in the 1950s/1960s

Scope of Work and Timeline

- Only doing removal at the two properties in the neighborhood.
- Next steps & timeline of removal.
 - Digging will begin first week of October.
 - 1 to 2 months of work.
 - Heavy equipment will be brought into the neighborhood for removal of contaminated soil and replacement with clean fill
 - Request that residents living on Darlington Cir south of 679 refrain from parking along streets during daytime hours (8:00 am-4:00 pm)
 - The EPA has identified trees on both properties to be protected

Development and Zoning Report

- 3121 and 3125 Piedmont Road (Former Divan Property)
 - The owner (Ice Box) and developer made a preliminary presentation to the SPI-9 Development Review Committee in early Nov 2022
 - They made a presentation to Peachtree Park representatives for feedback in Nov 2022; primary concerns expressed included:
 - Design of ingress/egress with much traffic being directed onto Martina
 - Plans for outside deck for restaurant/lounge that will generate noise
 - Limited parking that will result in additional parked cars on Martina
 - Rear setbacks to meet code
 - Their formal meeting with the SPI-9 DRC in June 2023 was cancelled due to their failure to present plans to the City of Atlanta planning dept
 - Acquired permit to remove mold from buildings

Other Activities

- Burke Road Entrance Marker
 - City of Atlanta has approved the construction
 - Working to schedule construction date with the contractor
- Attended Citywide Meetings
 - Mayor's Summit on Neighborhoods- Jan 2023
 - Quarterly Summit for Neighborhood Presidents- April 2023
 - Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods- Sept 2023



Treasurer Report




PPCA Revenue




APD Peachtree Park Crime Data (1/1/23 - 9/20/23)




Larceny from vehicle: n=14





Communications

What We Do:

- Build, maintain & update the communications distribution list using the PPCA membership database.
- Important to maintain your online profile to ensure all information accurate including the primary contact.
- Online membership profiles can be managed on the Peachtree Park website, <u>peachtreeparkatl.org</u>, under the Members tab.
- Communications are sent to all residents, members and non members, with a few exceptions members only social events, PPCA election ballot and the annual meeting invitation.
- Communications are sent electronically via MailerLite from the email address,
 <u>communications@peachtreeparkatl.org</u>. If you are not receiving communications, first check spam and/or send me an email and I can assist.
- Currently we have 689 email addresses in our distribution list.
- Average open rate on communications sent is 73+%

 - 8 separate locations
 - o over 12,000 bags/year

 - Reset and Concrete stone curbing
 - Play-face wood mulch
 - Two new benches and kids picnic tables
- \$4,500 Tree removal & trimming at GA400 park & pedestrian bridge

Infrastructure

What We Do

- Help maintain a safe & visually pleasing neighborhood
- Maintain the beauty of our historic neighborhood

How We Do It

- Serve as secondary point of contact for residents with infrastructure issues, after 911 (emergency) and 311 (nonemergency)
- Address repairs to streets (potholes, sinkholes), light outages, etc.
- Knowledge center for all neighborhood infrastructure issues
- Able to escalate recurring and/or unsolved issues

2023 Updates / Accomplishments

East Paces Road Closure

 E. Paces Ferry was closed in Q1 2023 for infrastructure repairs - now complete, with access restored

Neighborhood Entrance Markers

- Burke Steve has worked to hire a contractor to replace the entrance marker at Burke
- Highland the pillar on the walking path by the InterContinental was knocked down in H1-23, to be repaired by the same contractor

Dangerous Tree Limbs

- Large limbs have come down during summer storms, most recently twice on Park Cir.
- Alert the City's Arborist division or us of anything that looks precarious and / or dangerous


Where: Fetch Dog Park Buckhead
